Achievements

Extracurricular activities:

- Phonetics workshops: students from several high schools were involved in phonetics lessons to help alumni understand how speech sounds are produced. Students could practice making various sounds, differentiate between similar sounds, and even try transcribing spoken words using the International Phonetic Alphabet (IPA). The lesson aims to improve students' awareness of language sounds and enhance their pronunciation and listening skills.

Fundraising activities:

In November 2023, several students from the university English Programme and I carried out different fundraising activities on behalf of a local animal shelter aimed to generate financial support for the shelter's operations, which include providing food, shelter, and medical care for the dogs. The main goal was to engage the students, raise awareness about the shelter's needs, and encourage donations to support the well-being of the animals.
